<p>Guest Speaker: Jefferson Behavioral Health</p> <p>Heather Hartman presented a PowerPoint presentation. It will be sent out and attached with the minutes.</p> <p>Questions and Answers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Does JBH provide services to those who are not on OHP? <p>No, but we can refer. We do oversee a separate fund for Indigent (people who are homeless and do not have coverage) for acute care services. This is done as a region, the counties pool their money. Currently there is a 50% proposed cut to those funds at the State level due to the economy.</p>	<p>Review and update the Operating Principles in the upcoming months.</p>	

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Is the Quality Management Committee the same as the Care Coordinators Committee? They are separate things. The Care Coordinators are employed by the counties and are responsible for all the kids in the ISA level of care, and ensure that services occur, Child and Family Teams are occurring, that care is coordinated with the separate agencies, and they look at the continued stay reviews. • How much of the money for OHP is Medicaid and how much from the State? Traditionally 70% is from the Federal Government and 30% from the state. The concept behind OHP is to try and match a greater amount of match to provide more services for individuals. This allows for more than the defined eligible list from the Federal government to be served (those who don't qualify for Medicaid). • What member of this council takes this information from this committee to the board? That information is shared from staff and Karen and Bob brief our Executive Director and he reads the minutes. This info is reported from the Executive Director to the Board. The same as the County Mental Health Directors, The Quality Management Committee, and the Providers Committee. The committee goes this way. Individuals are welcome to attend the Board meeting and provide comments during that portion of the agenda. <p>JBH is a governmental entity. It functions similarly to a city or county government. Feedback from committees and staff report to the board. There is also time for community member input.</p> <p>Aaron, our new member, talked about his experience in the Youth Advisory Council at Options, and how they have advised Options. Spoke about how they are working on making Options a more inviting place for consumers. They have been able to get some paintings to hang up make it more inviting. They were able to get some paintings through the local schools as well as through consumers.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How is County and Provider input given to JBH on quality management? There are Quality Assurance Committees at the county level where this occurs and it filters up through the Quality Improvement Coordinator. 		
<p>Report Distribution Children's Utilization Management Plan This plan is a product that has been created through advice through consumers, providers, the state, and the community. It is official and board approved.</p>		

<p>Topics Of the Day Council's Role Handed out list of Topics. Asked to have the group bring back one or two things off the list they would like to work on so that we can decide on this next month.</p> <p>Additional Topic for Suggestion: We have children in our system that have attachment disorder and are in foster care. Across the state we are finding that children with this diagnosis are going back and forth between foster care placement and residential treatment. Neither is an appropriate placement for them.</p> <p>Ideas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Foster Care Villages. Having a home, but not a family necessarily. An apartment or housing home. This would allow them to receive treatment, go to school, have professionals available, etc. <p>School Resource Disability Fact Sheets A resource has been found that helps to give information to teachers about mental health issues. This resource was shared with the group. It is available online and will be sent out to the council.</p>		
<p>Announcements Providers: None</p> <p>JBH: The next provider meeting is out of schedule due to a conference. Is occurring Tuesday June 30th. The council would like to combine with that meeting. So the next Regional Children's Council will occur then. Care Coordinators will be at 10:00, the Family Forum at 11:00, and the general meeting at 12:30</p> <p>Family Forum: None</p>		
<p>Questions and Concerns ICTS services have not been occurring in Curry County due to the lack of a professional to oversee them. How will the services be paid for to cover the positions required for this service? They should have sent an application to the state by June 5th.</p> <p>They are working out how to have the Care Coordinator and the Skills Training Positions filled for the children. There have been discussions on how to do this as well as to provide oversight by a Child Psychiatrist.</p>
